Rest assured your elected officials care too - although

a major update to the plan was not required to be adopted until 2022, the Board of Commissioners moved forward in 2016 with a full update to address community concerns over post-recession growth. The Comprehensive Plan update was adopted one year ago this month with a continuation of the work program to implement and execute all recommendations. The update is already helping to shape our county in many ways, such as lowering density in every residential category which includes the removal of any free standing apartments.

Last month we kicked off the public engagement process for the review and improvement of the county's tree ordinance, regulations pertaining to mass grading and an incentives program for

innovative, low impact storm water design. These items were identified as implementation measures in the Comprehensive Plan update, and we're working to ensure they are properly addressed. Another important initiative - an identified task within the Comprehensive Plan's Community Work Program – is the development of new design and performance standards for Res2, Res3 and Res4 zoning districts, a process which is under way

We greatly appreciate your involvement both in the Comprehensive Plan update process and now in the efforts that are a direct result of the update. Your participation in your county government, and in projects such as these, will help guide our community forward in the very best direction possible. Forsyth County Parks & Recreation will begin accepting registrations for fall baseball and softball on Monday, July 23 through 5 pm on Wednesday, August 8. Baseball and softball leagues are offered for boys and girls ages 4 (by September 1, 2018) through 17.

Registrations will be accepted online at www.forsythco.com/parks and at the county's three recreation centers located at Central Park (2300 Keith Bridge Road), Fowler Park (4110 Carolene Way) and Old Atlanta Park (810 Nichols Road). The registration fee is \$75 for Forsyth County residents and \$150 for non-county residents.

League practices will begin the week of August 27 with games beginning the week of September 10. The fall league is an instructional program where participants will learn and practice game skills and rules. It's a great program to participate in prior to the spring baseball and softball program.
