Items such as chemicals, batteries, flammables, paints and stains, automotive products, electronics, pool chemicals and pesticides will be accepted. Medical waste, ammunition, pharmaceuticals and non-hazardous items will not be accepted during the event. For a complete list of acceptable

Water is crucial to life, yet it is often something we take for granted. We assume that when we turn the handle at the sink or shower, we will have fresh, clean water available for our use. And we rest assured

that the water leaving our homes is being managed in an environmentally-friendly manner.

During the first week of May Forsyth County will be recognizing two water-related events. The first is National Drinking Water Week (May 5-11). During this week we recognize that tap water delivers public health protection, fire protection, as well as support for our economy and the quality of life we enjoy.

On May 6, we will celebrate Water Professionals Appreciation Day. On this day we recognize all of those who work to ensure that clean water is produced and provided throughout our community, used water is reclaimed and returned to the environment, and stormwater is protected and properly managed.

Forsyth County water professionals in field and facility operations are available 24 hours a day, seven days a week, 365 days a year. Our employees respond when something happens in the middle of the night or on a holiday.

Other water professionals provide customer service and billing assistance, administrative management and stormwater engineering. They provide water quality testing – on drinking water before it is sent to residents and businesses; on reclaimed water before it is returned to the environment; and on stormwater to monitor the health of creeks, streams and other waterways.

So the next time you see a water professional – whether at one of our facilities or out in the field – please join us in saying "thank you" to them, for all they do to keep the water flowing!


