## <u>Comprehensive Plan Update Process:</u> Implementation Workshops to be Held this Month

Foster Forsyth is the planning process for updating the Forsyth County Comprehensive Plan. Five in-person and one online Foster Forsyth Design Workshops were held in May. At these workshops, county residents worked collaboratively with planners to consider the land uses and character of different areas of the county. The workshops built upon the first round of workshops in April, which sought input from the public about their vision and priorities for the county's future.

The *Foster Forsyth* community survey, posted online between April 25 and May 22, garnered more than 4,000 responses. Information gathered by the survey will be used by the planning team to help establish the community's vision and priorities for the county's future.

This June, *Foster Forsyth* will hold Implementation Workshops. At these workshops, residents can provide input that will assist in shaping the implementation program to help realize the vision for Forsyth County. ## Roads Renamed to Honor Fallen Firefighters



During the May 19 meeting of the Forsyth County Board of Commissioners, tribute was paid to honor the three line-of-duty deaths the Fire Department has experienced since its inception. Roads renamed for fallen Firefighters Allyn Lane, Dennis C. Martin and Brant Chesney were the focus of a presentation during the meeting.

- The roadway leading into Shady Grove Campground is designated as "Allyn Lane Memorial Way."
- The roadway leading into Coal Mountain Park is designated as "Dennis C. Martin Memorial Way."
- The roadway along Forsyth County Fire Station 10 on Old Atlanta Road is designated as "Brant Chesney Way."

The roads were renamed as a way to memorialize these firefighters who died in the line of duty.

# Hammond's Crossing & Coal Mountain Intersection Officially Dedicated





Hammond's Crossing at Highways 306 and 369 and Coal Mountain Intersection at Highways 9 and 369 were officially dedicated on May 4 and 6.

Hammond's Crossing has been a hub for the local economy since its first general store in 1897, owned by William Henry Hammond. Today, the Hammond family continues to operate Hammond's Fishing Center.

The name for the area of Coal Mountain can be found as far back as the 1870 federal census and has been home to a general store, Wofford Hatchery, Martin's Store, Coal Mountain Building Supply, Thomas Lumber Company and the office of Dr. William Bottoms.

## Update on Widening of SR 400

The much-anticipated project to widen State Route (SR) 400 in Forsyth County is in the early stages of construction. The work will add one lane both north and south bound from McFarland Parkway to SR 369, and is being made possible thanks to voter approval in 2014 of the Forsyth County Transportation Bond.



The construction of the additional northbound lane began in November. The Georgia Department of Transportation (GDOT) is managing this project and anticipates opening a stretch of the new northbound lane – from McFarland Parkway to SR 141 – by September.

Forsyth County and GDOT are working hard to make important transportation improvements in our county. Thank you to the voters for making this project possible!

The Forsyth County Water & Sewer Department recently published its 2016 Water Quality Report, providing information from 2015 on where the county's water comes from, what it contains and how it compares to standards set by the regulatory agencies.
