

# Republican Consolidated Sample Ballot Side 1 of 2

## May 19, 2026 General Primary & Nonpartisan General Election

In today's election, you have three ballot types from which to choose: Republican ballot type, Democratic ballot type, and Nonpartisan ballot type. Georgia is an "open primary" state and voters do not register to vote by party.

- The Republican ballot type contains ONLY:
  - the candidates who qualified with the Republican Party for each partisan race on the ballot AND
  - the Republican Party straw poll questions AND
  - ALSO includes the Nonpartisan General Election races for judge/judicial contests.

This Forsyth County **Republican Consolidated Sample Ballot** includes all federal, state, countywide and county-level contests available countywide for the Republican General Primary & Nonpartisan General Election, including some district contests you are not eligible to vote on.
