

# **Forsyth County Voter Registrations and Elections**

## Challenge to Elector's eligibility

Date challenge received: <u>04/28/2022</u>

Name of Challenger: Frank Schneider

Electors challenged pursuant to Election Code section: <u>21-2-230</u>

Explanation: Per the challenge: "828 voters are challenged under OCGA Section 21-2-229 and OCGA Section 21-2-230 due to registration in NCOA, plus, where available, sale of property at which voters and/or their voting family members are registered, indicating they no longer reside in Forsyth County. 331 voters are challenged under OCGA Section 21-2-230 due to registration in NCOA for property owners/renters or their voting family members indicating they reside elsewhere in Forsyth County."

Date of Forsyth County Board of Voter Registrations & Elections (BRE) meeting/hearing: <u>The BRE held a Special Called meeting on May 5, 2022 to hear challenges to the qualifications of voters and their eligibility to vote in the May 24, 2022 General Primary & Nonpartisan General Election pursuant to the Official Code of Georgia Annotated 21-2-230(a).</u>

Outcome: The BRE met on May 5 to hear the challenge. BRE Vice Chairman Natt reported he conducted his own research on the list of challenged voters. Of the 1159 names on the list, 539 names remained registered to vote at the address on the challenged voter list. A motion was made to place the 539 voters in a challenged status. The motion failed with a 2-2 vote. A motion was made to postpone the challenge to the May 12, 2022 Special Called Meeting. Motion passed 3-1.

#### Dear Mandi,

Pursuant to the Official Code of Georgia Annotated (OCGA) Sections 21-2-229 and 21-2-230, as updated by Senate Bill 202 as

adopted in 2021, I attest that I am a registered voter within Forsyth County. Please find my challenges to each of the 1,159 voters, all of which are reflected in NCOA as having changed their address.

These challenges are for the following reasons:

828 voters are challenged under OCGA Section 21-2-229 and OCGA Section 21-2-230 due to registration in NCOA, plus, where available, sale of property at which voters and/or their voting family members are registered, indicating they no longer reside in Forsyth County.

331 voters are challenged under OCGA Section 21-2-230 due to registration in NCOA for property owners/renters or their voting family members indicating they reside elsewhere in Forsyth County.

The research for these challenges was performed during March and April, 2022.

These challenges are based on the following information:

- 1. Forsyth County Precinct 21 voter rolls as of 11/22/2020.
- 2. Current NCOA data via Melissa application.
- 3. Forsyth County Tax Assessor online records to document property sales from Forsyth County. Links to specific voters and voting family members are provided.
- 4. Various state Tax Assessor online records to document property purchases in other Georgia counties or other states.
- 5. Various voter registration online records to document voters are registered in other states.

#### Please

consider this my request that a hearing be held to determine these voters' eligibility to vote within Forsyth County, Georgia.

Please note a) of the total of 8,699 registered voters, 1,159 are flagged as changing addresses in NCOA, b) column AL contains a link to the property sale, where applicable and c) column AM contains links to property purchase and/or voter registration information, where

applicable. Voters number 1 through 828 are those challenged under both OCGA Section 21-2-229 and OCGA Section 21-2-230. Voters number 829 through 1,159 are challenged under OCGA Section 21-2-230 only, having moved within the county.
