

# NONPARTISAN SAMPLE BALLOT

## Forsyth County May 21, 2024 General Primary and Nonpartisan General Election

Georgia is an "open primary" state and voters do not register to vote by party. In today's election, the voter has three ballot types from which to choose: Democratic ballot type, Republican ballot type and Nonpartisan ballot type.

This is a **Nonpartisan** Sample Ballot. Your ballot will have only Nonpartisan Judge races.

The **Nonpartisan** ballot type:

- contains **ONLY** the nonpartisan general election candidates for the state and county.
- **does NOT** contain any races/candidates/questions from either the Democratic or Republican Parties.

**The Nonpartisan General Election contests also appear on the Democratic ballot type and on the Republican ballot type.**
