HOLDING AMPHIBIAN MONITORING WORKSHOP

Free event will offer chance to learn about local wildlife

FORSYTHCOUNTY, Georgia – Keep Forsyth County Beautiful and the Forsyth County Adopt-A-Stream program are teaming up to lead an evening class of 25 to listen for frog calls and find other amphibians. The goal of the free program will be for participants to learn more about the local ecosystem and discover new ways to help protect and monitor the water quality in Forsyth County’s lakes, streams and wetlands.

The workshop will be held Friday, May 20 from 6:30 to 9 p.m. at the Central Park Recreation Center located at 2300 Keith Bridge Road in Cumming.
