

HOLIDAY FIRE PREVENTION AND SAFETY TIPS

FROM THE FORSYTH COUNTY FIRE DEPARTMENT

- Keep anything that can burn at least three feet away from heating equipment, like a furnace, fireplace, wood stove or portable space heater.
- All decorations should be nonflammable or flame-retardant and placed away from heat vents.

Do not place your tree close to a heat source, including a fireplace or heat vent. The heat can dry out the tree, causing it to be more easily ignited by heat, flame or sparks.

In an emergency, always dial 911.



- Inspect holiday lights each year for frayed wires, bare spots, gaps in the insulation, broken or cracked sockets, and excessive kinking or wear before using them.
- Never place wrapping paper in a fireplace.
 Wrapping paper in the fireplace can
 result in a very large fire, throwing off
 dangerous sparks and embers that may
 result in a chimney fire.
- Remember to turn portable space heaters off when leaving the room or going to bed.
