## Johnson to Join Forsyth County Government as New County Manager

On August 3, the Board of Commissioners named Eric Johnson as the new county manager, filling the vacancy left by the retirement of Doug Derrer in April.

Mr. Johnson will bring to the position 30 years of experience in county government, serving most recently as assistant county administrator for Hillsborough County, Florida. He is slated to begin his new role with Forsyth County government on September 5.

#### Eagle's Beak Park Now Open in Northwest Forsyth County



The 226-acre Eagle's Beak Park, Forsyth County's newest park, features a canoe and kayak launch on the Etowah River, nature trails, restroom facility and parking. The park's construction was funded by the Parks, Recreation and Green Space Bond approved by Forsyth County voters in 2008 and by the Special Purpose Local Option Sales Tax (SPLOST) VI program.

Forsyth County is recognized as the healthiest county in the state. We are proud of this achievement and of the many parks and recreational amenities that help us earn that distinction. Total wellness, however, involves so much

more than what can be seen from the outside. Mental health is an essential component of overall well-being, and I'd like to invite you to two upcoming events that will address this topic. The first is our community's first ever suicide awareness and prevention event, which will be held September 20. Sadly, the Forsyth County coroner has worked 22 suicide cases so far this year. The second is the eighth Drug Summit, which will be held October 16. It saddens me to report that the coroner has worked 16 confirmed overdose cases so far this year. Among the speakers at the summit will be Alan Schwarz, an investigative journalist and author who will discuss the staggering rise of Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder (A.D.H.D.) diagnoses and the nationwide issue of the abuse of Adderall. The Sheriff's Office will do a presentation about drugs in our community and what to look for in your home.

Both events will be held at the Forsyth Conference Center at Lanier Technical College and will provide resources on these topics, which are so important for our community to address. For both events, doors will open at 6 p.m. with speakers at 6:30 p.m. I hope to see you there.
