2020 Budget Update: Millage Rates Adopted by the **Board of Commissioners**

At their July 23 meeting, the Forsyth County Board of Commissioners adopted the millage rates that will fund the county's 2020 budget.

The county's millage rate of 7.936 mills is one of the lowest millage rates among metro-Atlanta counties.

Forsyth County staff, Finance Committee and Board of Commissioners will continue preparing the county's preliminary 2020 budget, which is slated for adoption in October.
