Keep Forsyth County Beautiful encourages residents to recycle their Christmas trees. Tree recycling is available at the county's three recycling convenience centers from December 26 through January 25. The service is free and helps keep trees out of landfills.

Trees are ground up and made into wood chips, available at no cost to county residents at our Coal Mountain Recycling Center (3560 Settingdown Rd.). Residents are responsible for loading and hauling their own wood chips.

HOLIDAY FIRE PREVENTION AND SAFETY TIPS FROM THE FORSYTH COUNTY FIRE DEPARTMENT

- Keep anything that can burn at least three feet away from heating equipment, like a furnace, fireplace, wood stove or portable space heater.
- All decorations should be nonflammable or flame-retardant and placed away from heat vents.
- Do not place your tree close to a heat source, including a fireplace or heat vent. The heat can dry out the tree, causing it to be more easily ignited by heat, flame or sparks.

In an emergency, always dial 911.
