

State Route 400 Widening Project is Underway

If you have driven on SR 400 recently, you might have noticed construction equipment. That is because the project to widen SR 400 from McFarland Parkway to SR 369 has begun. The work was kicked off November 4 with a groundbreaking ceremony. Crews have already begun repairing the damaged concrete driving surface of the existing lanes, and construction of the additional lanes – one in each direction along the 13.4-mile stretch – is expected to commence in the spring. The project is slated to be completed in mid-2018.

Stay Safe this Holiday Season

Help keep you and your family safe with these tips from the Forsyth County Fire Department. Find even more tips online at www.forsythco.com.

- Follow manufacturers' recommendations regarding where and how to use any heating devices.
- Have heating equipment and chimneys cleaned and inspected every year by a qualified professional.

• Remember to turn portable space heaters off when leaving the room or going to bed.

• Make sure the fireplace has a sturdy screen to stop sparks from flying into the room.

• Do not place your Christmas tree close to a heat source, including a fireplace or heat vent. The heat can dry out the tree, causing it to be more easily ignited by heat, flame or sparks.

- Be sure that Christmas trees and other holiday decorations do not block exits.
- Select toys to suit the age, abilities, skills and interest level of the intended child.
- Toys too advanced may pose safety hazards for younger children.
- In case of emergency, dial 911.
