## POLICY FOR MULTI-WAY STOP SIGNS

June 2012

- 1) Installation of additional Stop signs within a subdivision to create multi-way stop intersection or intersections will require either a vote taken by the Homeowner's Association (HOA) or a petition of a simple majority of the subdivision residents which must utilize the intersection on a daily basis or to access the amenity area to be included in the count when determining the percentage in favor of the signs.
- 2) If the subdivision does not have a HOA the petition included below can be used to collect the necessary signatures of the subdivision residents and must clearly state at the top of each petition the intersection street names of the proposed multi-way stop location(s).
- 3) If the subdivision has a HOA a letter of request from the HOA President noting the date of the vote taken by HOA for approval of the additional stop signs for the intersection(s) to Forsyth County for consideration.
- 4) Upon review and approval by the County, the following course of action will take place:
  - a) County maintained signs We will schedule the multi-way stop installation as soon as possible at no cost to the HOA.
  - b) Custom maintained signs The HOA will be responsible for the installation and cost to acquire the additional stop signs.
