Absentee Vote By Mail: Accepting Applications/Mailing Ballots Now Through Friday, June 5

Early/Saturday/Advance Voting In Person: Weekdays, May 18 thru June 5 & Saturday, May 30
Locations and Hours vary by day.

Vote on Election Day at your designated Polling Place: Tuesday, June 9

VOTER REGISTRATION DEADLINE: May 11, 2020

In Georgia, to be eligible to vote in any election and any subsequent runoff, voters must be registered to vote 30 days prior to that election.

The Voter Registration Deadline for this election is: **Monday, May 11, 2020**

All voters are encouraged to confirm they are registered to vote and their name and address appear correctly in the statewide voter registration system.

Go to www.mvp.sos.ga.gov to verify your information or call the Elections Office.

Forsyth County residents who need to register to vote or change their name and/or address can do so:

Online: Go to registertovote.sos.ga.gov/GAOLVR/ or www.mvp.sos.ga.gov.

To use the Online Voter Registration System, you must have a valid driver's license or identification card issued by the GA Department of Driver Services (DDS) with your signature on file with DDS. The Application must be dated no later than 11:59 p.m. on the Voter Registration Deadline date. If you do not have a valid driver's license or identification card, you will be allowed to print and manually submit a paper registration. The Application must be USPS postmarked by the Voter Registration Deadline date or delivered in person to our office no later than the close of business (4:30 p.m.) on the Voter Registration Deadline date in order to be eligible to vote in the upcoming election.

In person: You may register to vote at the Forsyth County Voter Registrations and Elections Office, located at 1201 Sawnee Dr., Cumming, GA 30040 or at any public library in the county. The Elections Office hours are Monday through Friday from 8:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Applications can be downloaded at www.forsythco.com and are also available at the Elections Office and at any public library.

By Mail: A Voter Registration Application must be completely filled out and signed. The Application must be USPS postmarked by the Voter Registration Deadline or delivered in person to our office no later than the close of business (4:30 p.m.) on the Voter Registration Deadline in order to be eligible to vote in the upcoming election. Applications can be downloaded at www.forsythco.com and are also available at the Elections Office and at any public library.

All properly completed applications received by the Voter Registrations and Elections Office not meeting the above deadline will be processed after the General Primary and/or NonPartisan General Election or General Primary and/or NonPartisan General Election Runoff (if applicable), and those individuals will be eligible to vote in future elections.

VOTER REGISTRATION REQUIREMENTS

In order to be eligible to register to vote a person must be a citizen of the United States and the State of Georgia, at least 17 ½ years of age, a resident of the county or municipality in which he/she seeks to vote, not be currently serving a felony conviction, AND not be judicially determined to be mentally incompetent to vote.

PHOTO ID REQUIRED TO VOTE

Remember, all voters voting in person will be asked to provide one of the six acceptable forms of photo identification. Proper photo ID shall consist of any one of the following: GA driver's license (valid or expired), Valid ID card by any state or U.S. with photo, Valid U.S. passport, Valid government employee photo ID, Valid U.S. military ID card with photo, OR Valid tribal ID card with photo.

If you do not have one of these forms of photo identification, you are eligible to receive a free Georgia ID card for Voting Purposes ONLY. These cards are issued in the Voter Registrations and Elections Office. Please call us at 770-781-2118 for more information or to schedule an appointment to have a free Georgia ID card for Voting Purposes made.

Change in Election Date

On April 8, the Governor extended the public health state of emergency until May 13, 2020 due to the COVID-19 pandemic. On April 9, 2020 the Georgia Secretary of State postponed the General Primary, the NonPartisan General Election and the Presidential Preference Primary pursuant to the authority vested in him by O.C.G.A. 21-2-50.1. to “provide additional protection and safety resources to county election officials, poll workers and voters without affecting the November election.” The election was scheduled to take place on May 19; the election is now scheduled to take place on June 9.

What exactly are we voting on?

There are five separate elections taking place: The Democratic General Primary, the Republican General Primary, the Democratic Presidential Preference Primary, the Republican Presidential Preference Primary and the NonPartisan General Election. We know, it can be confusing. Remember that voters do not register by political party in the state of Georgia; at the time of a primary the voter will need to choose a ballot type. See page 4 for more details.

ELECTION DEFINITIONS

What is a General Primary?

A primary is held by a political party to nominate candidates for public office to be voted on in the ensuing November General Election. In Georgia, there are two General Primary elections taking place: the Democratic General Primary and the Republican General Primary. A voter must choose which Primary they wish to vote in. Because Georgia voters do not register to vote by party, each voter must choose the ballot type to receive at the time they submit their request for a ballot: Democratic, Republican or NonPartisan.

What Happens to the Winner of a Primary/Primary Runoff?

The winner of the Republican Primary (or Primary Runoff) in a specific race will be the person whose name appears on the ballot in the General Election as the Republican designee. Likewise, the winner of the Democratic Primary (or Primary Runoff) in a specific race will be the person whose name appears on the ballot in the General Election as the Democratic designee. In Georgia, a Runoff is necessary when no candidate in a specific race receives a majority of the votes cast - 50 percent of the votes cast plus one vote. If needed, the Runoff will be comprised of the two candidates who received the most votes in the particular race(s) in the Primary. The possible Runoff date is set for August 11, 2020.

What is a NonPartisan General Election?

A NonPartisan General Election is held to elect those offices for which it has been determined by State Election Code that the candidates shall not qualify with any political party. There are 11 state and local races in the NonPartisan General Election.

Why does the option for ‘Write-In’ appear on some races, but not other races on the ballot?

Write-In candidates are NOT permitted in the *General Primary races*. Write-In candidates are ONLY permitted in the *NonPartisan General Election* and the *General Election*. Write-In candidates are possible in the *NonPartisan General Election* races on the June 9 ballot, but NOT in the *General Primary* races on the same ballot. There are no certified write-in candidates for any races on the June 9 ballot.

What is a Presidential Preference Primary?

The upcoming election includes the statewide **Presidential Preference Primary**, which has been called so that voters may express their preference for one person to be the candidate for nomination by such person’s party or body for the office of President of the United States. *On March 14 the Presidential Preference Primary (PPP), originally scheduled for March 24, was postponed. The PPP was postponed to be held in conjunction with the General Primary and NonPartisan General Election.*

All ballots cast for the Presidential Preference Primary during Advance Voting in March and all voted absentee ballots returned to the Elections Office will be counted on June 9. In Georgia, there are two Presidential Preference Primary elections taking place: the Democratic Presidential Preference Primary and the Republican Presidential Preference Primary. A voter must choose which Primary they wish to vote in. Because Georgia voters do not register to vote by party, each voter must choose the ballot type they wish to receive at the time they submit their request for a ballot: Democratic, Republican or NonPartisan. **NOTE:** There will be **NO** Runoff for the Presidential Preference Primary.

BALLOT TYPE CHOICES

Georgia Voters do NOT register to vote by Political Party. You are simply a registered voter in Forsyth County, Georgia. However, at the time of a Primary, a voter must designate which ballot type they wish to vote. For this election, there are three ballot types to choose from: Democratic, Republican or NonPartisan. A voter's choice of ballot type today may be different from what it has been in the past or may be in the future.

Democratic Ballot Type: The Democratic Ballot Type contains **ONLY:**

- **the candidates who qualified with the Democratic Party** for each partisan race for your districts **AND**
 - the straw poll questions submitted by the state and county Democratic Party **AND**
 - the NonPartisan General Election races.
 - IF a voter cast their ballot for the March Presidential Preference Primary (PPP) – either the voter cast a ballot in person during the 11 days of Advance Voting or the voter returned their voted absentee ballot that was mailed to them – the voter's ballot for the May elections will **ONLY** include the Democratic General Primary and the NonPartisan General Election. The race for United States President will not appear on their ballot. They have already voted in the PPP and their vote will be counted on Election Day, June 9 when all ballots for these elections will be counted.
 - IF a voter did NOT cast their ballot for the PPP – or they requested a ballot be mailed to them, but they have not returned their voted ballot as of the time the ballot for the May elections is issued – the voter will receive a *combined* ballot. The voter's ballot will include the Democratic Presidential Preference Primary, the Democratic General Primary and the NonPartisan General Election.
 - A voter will only be able to vote for the PPP once. If a voter returns both their original PPP voted ballot and a voted *combined* ballot, the original PPP ballot will be cancelled, and the combined ballot will be counted.

Republican Ballot Type: The Republican Ballot Type contains **ONLY:**

- **the candidates who qualified with the Republican Party** for each partisan race for your districts **AND**
 - the straw poll questions submitted by the state and county Republican Party **AND**
 - the NonPartisan General Election races.
 - IF a voter cast their ballot for the March Presidential Preference Primary (PPP) – either the voter cast a ballot in person during the 11 days of Advance Voting or the voter returned their voted absentee ballot that was mailed to them – the voter's ballot for the May elections will **ONLY** include the Republican General Primary and the NonPartisan General Election. The race for United States President will not appear on their ballot. They have already voted in the PPP and their vote will be counted on Election Day, June 9 when all ballots for these elections will be counted.
 - IF a voter did NOT cast their ballot for the PPP – or they requested a ballot be mailed to them, but they have not returned their voted ballot as of the time the ballot for the May elections is issued – the voter will receive a *combined* ballot. The voter's ballot will include the Republican Presidential Preference Primary, the Republican General Primary and the NonPartisan General Election.
 - A voter will only be able to vote for the PPP once. If a voter returns both their original PPP voted ballot and a voted *combined* ballot, the original PPP ballot will be cancelled, and the combined ballot will be counted.

NonPartisan Ballot Type: The NonPartisan Ballot Type contains **ONLY:**

- the NonPartisan General Election races.
- This ballot type does **NOT** contain any partisan races/candidates or straw poll questions submitted by either the Democratic Party or the Republican Party.
- The NonPartisan General Election races appear on all three ballot types.

Vote at Your Convenience: Have a Ballot Mailed to You!

Voters are highly encouraged to take advantage of voting by mail in the upcoming election. All persons desiring to have a ballot mailed to them must first submit a signed, written request/application to the Forsyth County Voter Registrations and Elections Office.

A voter's signed Request/Absentee Ballot Application may be submitted by email of a scanned copy, by email of a picture of the signed application, by fax, by mail *or* by personal delivery.

A voter may request a ballot be mailed to them for any election and is not required to provide a reason for the request. It's easy to request a ballot be mailed to you. The request/application must contain the following:

- the voter's name
- the voter's address as registered
- the voter's mailing address (if different from registration address),
- the voter's date of birth
- the date of the election (**June 9, 2020**),
- the voter's ballot type choice (Democratic, Republican or NonPartisan)
- **AND** must be signed by the voter.

(The voter's signature on the ballot request/application is compared to the signature we have on file for the voter as a way to verify the voter. Unsigned applications or applications where the signature is simply typed in will result in a delay in the processing of the voter's absentee ballot application).

On March 24, the Georgia Secretary of State announced that an absentee ballot application is being mailed to all voters in active status in the statewide voter registration database. These temporary steps are being made because of the COVID-19 pandemic threatening public health in Georgia and around the world. This is a concerted effort by the State to allow Georgia voters to exercise their right to vote without leaving their homes and ensuring they can vote without fear for their health. Voters are highly encouraged to take advantage of voting by mail in the upcoming election.

You do not need to wait to receive your application from the Secretary of State. You may access and print an application online. The application can be found at <https://www.forsythco.com/Departments-Offices/Voter-Registrations-Elections>. Voters may also contact our office to have an absentee ballot application mailed or faxed to them for completion. All properly completed and submitted requests, including those requests submitted prior to the election being postponed to June 9, will be processed and fulfilled. Any request that lists the election date of 'May 19' will also be processed without delay.

What Happens Next?

- If the Application meets all requirements, a ballot will be mailed to the voter.
- If the Application *does not* meet all requirements, the voter will be contacted by the Elections Office by letter (or possibly by phone or email).

How do I know if my Application met all the requirements?

Go to www.mvp.sos.ga.gov. Login by entering your information. On your “My Voter Page” look under “Click here for Absentee Ballot status.” This will show if your application was accepted and if so, when your ballot was mailed. *This website is expected to be updated by approximately April 21, 2020 – see below under ‘When will my ballot be mailed to me?’ for additional details.*

When will my ballot be mailed to me?

If you have a properly completed application on file with our office before April 21, 2020 then your ballot will be mailed to you approximately April 21. If you submit a properly completed application after that time, then your ballot is expected to be mailed to you within three business days of our office receiving your completed application.

What if I do not receive my ballot in a timely fashion?

If, after a reasonable amount of time, you have not received your ballot or follow up communication from our office, do not delay -- contact our office. There is a process to re-issue a ballot lost in the mail. It is better to start that process sooner rather than later.

What do I do when I receive my absentee ballot in the mail?

Follow the instructions included with your ballot and do not forget to SIGN the ‘Oath of Elector’ and Print Your Name on the back of the return envelope. When your ballot is returned, your signature on the ‘Oath of Elector’ is compared to the signature on your previous registration(s) and your absentee ballot application/request in order to verify your identity. If the ‘Oath of Elector’ is not signed, processing of your ballot could be delayed.

How quickly do I need to return my voted ballot to your office?

A voter may return their voted absentee ballot as soon as they have made their selections, completed and signed the ‘Oath of Elector’ and are able to mail or personally deliver it to our office. Absentee ballots can be returned to our office either by mail or by personal delivery. The latest a voter may return their voted ballot is Election Day, which means it must be in our office before the polls close at 7pm on Election Day in order to be accepted. The postmark date does **NOT** count. (There are special provisions for voters in the military and/or living overseas. Contact our office for details).

Where/How can I return my voted absentee ballot?

Voted absentee ballots may be returned by mail or they may be deposited into the Official Absentee Ballot Drop Box available at the Forsyth County Elections Office located at 1201 Sawnee Drive, Cumming, 30040. The Drop Box is available to voters 24 hours a day. This allows voters the opportunity to return their absentee ballot contact-free.

How do I know if my voted absentee ballot was received by your office?

Check it out online, go to www.mvp.sos.ga.gov. Login by entering your information. On your “My Voter Page” click on “Click here for Absentee Ballot status” under the ‘Absentee Ballot Request Information’ header. This will show if and when your voted ballot was received. Don’t have access to the internet? Contact the Elections Office. We are happy to verify that information for you.

When will my Voted Absentee Ballot be Opened?

On Election Day. All absentee ballots remain sealed and under lock and key until Election Day. And, yes, following GA Election Code all absentee ballots submitted and accepted are counted in the final totals for every election. *All ballots cast for the Presidential Preference Primary during Advance Voting in March & all voted absentee ballots returned to the Elections Office will be opened and tabulated on June 9.*

DEADLINE TO REQUEST A BALLOT BE MAILED TO YOU

Voters may request an absentee ballot by mail beginning 180 days prior to an election. You may request an absentee ballot for the June 9 elections now. **Requests for absentee ballots are usually processed within 3 business days after receipt in our office. The last day an absentee ballot can be mailed for the upcoming election is Friday, June 5, 2020. The absentee ballot application must be received in our office by the close of business (4:30 p.m.) in order to be processed and mailed by Friday, June 5.**

WHAT IS AN ABSENTEE VOTER? Per Georgia Election Code 21-2-380 (a) the term “absentee elector” means an elector of this state who casts a ballot in a primary, election or runoff other than in person at the polls on Election Day. Any voter who votes in person during Advance Voting or who requests their ballot be mailed to them is classified as an ‘Absentee Voters’ They are ‘absent’ from their polling place on Election Day. A voter is not required to state a reason to request a ballot be mailed to them.

What if I request a ballot be mailed to me and then I decide I want to vote in person?

You can do that. If you have received your ballot, take it with you to the polling place and surrender it to the poll worker. Your absentee ballot will be cancelled in the system and then you will be allowed to vote in person on the election equipment. If you did not receive your ballot yet or it has been lost/destroyed, you will be instructed by the poll worker to complete an Affidavit attesting to not having your ballot in your possession. After the poll worker contacts the Elections Office and confirms you have not already returned your voted ballot, your absentee ballot will be cancelled in the system and then you will be allowed to vote in person on the election equipment. There are checks and balances in place throughout the process to ensure each voter casts just one ballot.

If the Elections Office has already received your properly submitted voted absentee ballot, then you have been given credit for voting and the ballot you returned to the Elections Office will be counted. In this case, you will not be allowed to vote in person.

ABSENTEE VOTING TURNOUT STATISTICS

The Forsyth County Voter Registrations and Elections Office posts the Absentee Voting Turnout Statistics Report, which includes how many absentee ballots have been mailed, how many voted ballots have been returned to the Elections Office, as well as how many voters have cast their ballot by Absentee Voting In Person (Advance Voting), to our website daily. The turnout statistics posted are through the day before and are posted by approximately 11:00 a.m.

Election Results

Election Results are reported by votes cast in person on Election Day, voted absentee ballots that have been returned to the Elections Office and votes cast in person during Advance Voting.

VOTE IN PERSON EARLY, BEFORE ELECTION DAY, DURING 3 WEEKS OF ADVANCE VOTING

Please be advised, voters are highly encouraged to vote by mail in the upcoming election, if possible.

On March 24, the Georgia Secretary of State announced that an absentee ballot application were being mailed to all voters in active status in the statewide voter registration database. These temporary steps are being made because of the COVID-19 pandemic threatening public health in Georgia and around the world. This is a concerted effort by the State to allow Georgia voters to exercise their right to vote without leaving their homes and ensuring they can vote without fear for their health.

Voting in person remains an option. Poll Workers will follow the county, state and federal recommended guidelines, which means that extra steps are being taken to limit the threat of COVID-19 at the polling place. Voters who show up to vote in person will be instructed to maintain a safe distance throughout the voting process to help ensure the health and safety of the voters and the poll workers. In order to implement these changes voting equipment numbers have been reduced. Additionally, the voting equipment and other items will be sanitized routinely; therefore, increased wait times and lines are likely during Advance Voting and on Election Day. Voters are encouraged to vote-by-mail if possible.

As of April 9, Advance Voting is scheduled to take place from Monday, May 18 through Friday, June 5, including, Saturday, May 30. Any Forsyth County registered voter may take advantage of Advance Voting in person during the hours and dates posted, regardless of where they are assigned to vote on Election Day. Only the Elections Office is open for all days of Advance Voting. ***On May 5 the Forsyth County Board of Voter Registrations and Elections voted to make some changes to Advance Voting locations and dates in light of the COVID-19 pandemic. The Board voted to not open the Parks and Recreation Natural Resources Operations Center for Advance Voting during the upcoming election. This remains an Election Day polling place for those voters assigned to the 37-Sawnee precinct. Additionally, the Voter Registrations and Elections Office will be the only location open for Advance Voting for the first two weeks of Advance Voting and Saturday, May 30. Hampton Park Library, Midway Park Community Building and Sharon Springs Park Community Building will be open for Advance Voting from Monday, June 1 through Friday, June 5.***

Due to the length of the ballot, voters are encouraged to review their Sample Ballot prior to going to the polls to vote and may do so by going to www.mvp.sos.ga.gov.

- On Election Day, Tuesday, June 9, 2020 voters must go to their designated polling place to vote.
- All twenty Forsyth County Election Day polling places are open for voting from 7am to 7pm on Election Day.
- The list of Election Day Voting Precincts and Polling Places is attached to this Guide.

Please be advised, voters are highly encouraged to vote by mail in the upcoming election, if possible.

On March 24, the Georgia Secretary of State announced that an absentee ballot application is being mailed to all voters in active status in the statewide voter registration database. These temporary steps are being made because of the COVID-19 pandemic threatening public health in Georgia and around the world. This is a concerted effort by the State to allow Georgia voters to exercise their right to vote without leaving their homes and ensuring they can vote without fear for their health. For more information about requesting a ballot be mailed to you, please see pages 5 & 6 of this Guide.

Voting in person remains an option. Poll Workers will follow the county, state and federal recommended guidelines, which means that extra steps are being taken to limit the threat of COVID-19 at the polling place. Voters who show up to vote in person will be instructed to maintain a safe distance throughout the voting process to help ensure the health and safety of the voters and the poll workers. In order to implement these changes voting equipment numbers have been reduced. Additionally, the voting equipment and other items will be sanitized routinely; therefore, increased wait times and lines are likely during Advance Voting and on Election Day. Voters are encouraged to vote-by-mail if possible.

Things to Note on Election Day:

- *****NEW POLLING PLACES, effective January 2020:** Attention voters: 5 new Election Day polling places opened in 2020. The designated Election Day polling place has changed for approximately 50,000 registered voters in Forsyth County. Please verify your Election Day polling place at www.mvp.sos.ga.gov prior to going to the polls.
- Advance Voting Location MAY NOT be Your Designated Election Day Polling Place Remember, four of the five Advance Voting locations (Hampton Park Library, Midway Park Community Building, Sharon Springs Park Community Building and Parks & Recreation Natural Resources Operations Center) are also Election Day polling places. However, ON Election Day ONLY those voters who are assigned to those designated polling places should go there to vote.
- The Forsyth County Elections Office IS NOT Open for Voting ON Election Day. The Forsyth County Elections Office is open for all of Advance Voting BUT IS NOT an Election Day polling place. Our office is open all day on Election Day to answer any questions a voter may have; however, there is NO voting in the building ON Election Day. A voter's polling place ON Election Day is specific to where their residence (as registered) falls within designated precinct lines.

IN PERSON OBSERVATION OF TABULATION

Advance Voting, Absentee By Mail and Election Day totals are not tabulated until after the polls close on Election Night. On Election Night (after the polls have closed), the public may observe the tabulation of votes at the Forsyth County Elections Office, 1201 Sawnee Drive, Cumming, 30040. Election results will not be displayed and announced until all votes are tallied with the exception of provisional votes, which are tabulated at the time the Board meets to certify the election.
